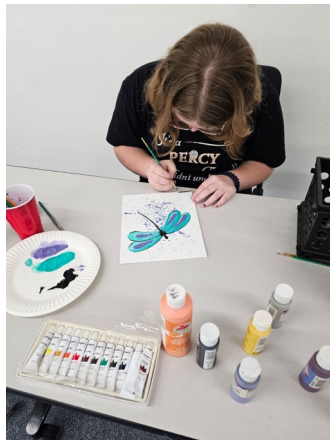
Manton Club Report ... *G. Rodriguez, Reporter*
