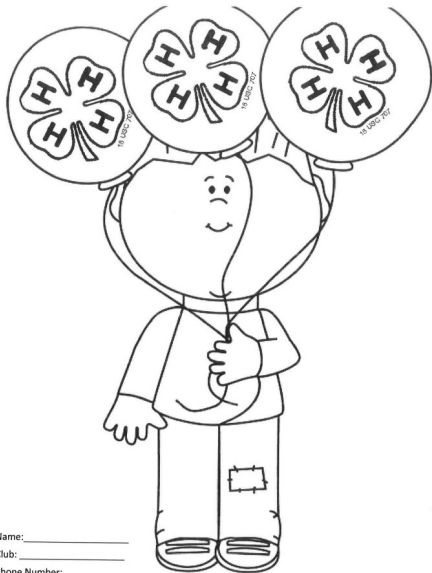

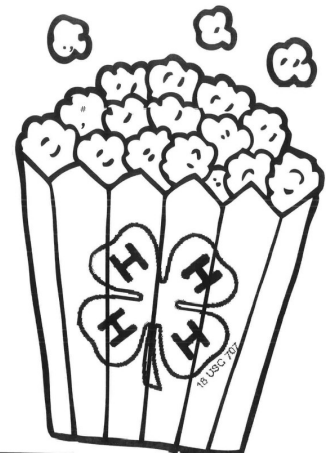
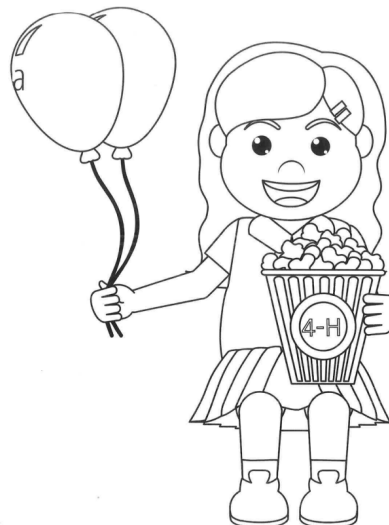

Bacon Wrapped Blackberry Pork Tenderloin

*Overall Intermediate Winner,
Makayla Lodin Flournoy-Paskenta Club*

Ingredients:

One 4-5 lb. tenderloin
8oz cream cheese
1/4 cup nuts (toasted)
1/2 cup drained and sliced sun
dried tomatoes in oil
1/2 cup baby spinach leaves, rinsed
and spun dried
10 slices of bacon
Salt and freshly ground black
pepper

1/4 cup blackberry preserves
3 tablespoons white wine vinegar
2 tablespoons dijon mustard
2 teaspoons fresh thyme
kosher salt and freshly ground
black pepper
1 clove garlic smashed
2 red onions quartered



Combine the preserves, 1 Tbls vinegar, the mustard thyme and 1/2 tsp each salt & pepper in a small bowl. Poke the pork in a few spots with a knife, then rub with garlic, season with salt and pepper. Rub the port all over with more preserves mixture, then transfer to a large resealable bag and refrigerate at least 2 hours or overnight. Slice the pork tenderloin lengthwise so it will open like a book, being careful to not cut all the way through. (or easier yet ask your butcher to butterfly cut it for you). Gently pound with a meat mallet until it is an even thickness and rectangle in shape. Sprinkle the meat with salt and pepper. Spread the cream cheese in an even layer on the meat, leaving a 1/2 inch of pork uncovered around the edge. Spread the pesto on the top of the cream cheese, then sprinkle on the nuts and sundried tomatoes. Top with an even layer of spinach. Starting on one of the longer sides of your rectangle, roll the meat closed into a long tub and set aside. Place a piece of plastic wrap on a flat surface and lay out the bacon so the slices overlap slightly. Lay the rolled pork tenderloin at one end of the bacon strip arrangement, seam up side down, Using the plastic wrap, roll the bacon up and around the meat. Twine with butchers twine, around the bacon at every 2 inches the whole length of the roll. so that the bacon cannot come loose during cooking. Tuck the meat closed on both ends and secure with toothpicks. Place the pork, seam side down on the heated sheet pan and cool until the bacon is browned and the pork is cooked to 145 degrees when a thermometer is inserted -- approximately 1

to 1 1/2 hours at 325 degree oven. Check often as to not overcook and dry out. Meanwhile make the gravy. Discard all but 2 Tbls of the dripping from the pan, place in the roasting pan over burners over medium-low heat. and whisk in the flour until incorporated. Add the chicken broth and whisk until thickened, about 5 minutes. Add the remaining 2 Tbls vinegar and season with salt and pepper. Slice the roast and pour gravy over the top, garnish with blackberries and fresh thyme or rosemary sprigs .

2023 RULE CHANGES



- **Update Minimum & Maximum Sifting Weights**

- **Market Steers: 1050 lbs - 1500 lbs**
- **Poultry Meat Pens: 4 lbs - 7 lbs per Bird.**

All other species are the same as the previous year.

- **120 Day & 60 Day Tag-Ins**

All market animals must be tagged by the dates listed below. Leaders may check out ear tags, tag guns, and a clear plastic bag for the hair sample. A picture of the tagged animal with the exhibitor and a hair sample must be returned to the Fair Office by the ownership dates below.

- **Market Steers 120 Day Weigh-In-** January 4th by 5:00 PM
- **Market Lambs, Market Goats, Market Hogs-** March 6th by 5:00 PM
- **Chickens and Rabbits must be owned for 30 Days-** April 4th

- **Fair Weigh-Ins**

Large Animal Weigh-Ins: Wed., May 3rd 3:00-6:30 PM

Poultry Inspections/Weigh-Ins: Wed., May 3rd 1:00-3:00PM by the Tehama Room

Market Rabbits: Thursday, May 4th at 10:00 AM in the Ron Knight Building

All animals, excluding poultry, can start arriving on the grounds Wed., May 3rd

- **Weighing Back-Up Animals at Fair Weigh-Ins**

If the exhibitor's primary market animal fails to meet weight requirements or fails the veterinary check at weigh-ins the "Back-Up" animal may be weighed.

Large Animals: The Back-Up Animal must be on grounds for it to be weighed, after the primary animal is sifted. If the first animal across the scale is NOT sifted, the back-up animal cannot be weighed or unloaded on the grounds.

Small Animals: If a pen of three is sifted for weight, defects, or veterinary issues at weigh-ins the exhibitor will have two options; either replace ONE animal in their pen for ONE other animal or the exhibitor may choose to replace the entire pen or another pen. The exhibitor must choose one or the other, they cannot do both.

- **DNA Testing**

The Tehama District Fair Board of Directors reserves the right to randomly DNA Test all animals.

- **The Dog Show has been eliminated from the Fair.**

- **Paylean Ingestion in Hogs:** Paylean must be withheld from market hogs for a minimum of 10 days prior to arrival at the Fair and cannot be administered at the Fair

- **Ensuring Exhibitors Wear their Uniform**

Exhibitors not wearing the proper uniform will not be able to enter the Show Ring or Sale Ring.

Tehama County 4-H Contract for Tehama District Fair Market Animal

This contract outlines the requirements that must be completed by the 4-H member to sell at the Tehama District Fair. Form must be completed and submitted to the Tehama County 4-H office by the end of the business day of the due date.

1. Be an active member in the 4Honline enrollment system by **October's Council Meeting by 7 p.m.** (4th Tuesday) of the current program year.
2. Have submitted an Annual Project Report to your leader from the previous year. (Waived for 1st year members)
3. Complete at least six hours of your 4-H market animal project, or more, as required by the project leader.
4. Participate in a county event that is linked to your 4-H market animal project. (i.e. Beef Dish - Favorite Foods Day; Presentation on Swine - Swine Project)
5. Give a presentation at project, club, or county level in reference to your 4-H market animal project.
6. Meet the ownership requirements for your 4-H market animal project.
7. Complete the Annual YQCA training (This is requirement set by the Fair not 4-H)
8. Abide by the 4-H Member Code of Conduct.
9. Abide by the rules of Tehama District Fair.

After the sale:

- A completed Annual Project Report must be submitted to your club leader by your July 31st.

Failure to complete this contract will result in forfeiting your right to show/sell in the Tehama District Fair Market Animal Class.

Bowman Club Report ...written by Aaron Flood

Bowman 4-H is a big and fun group! We are having fun at our monthly meetings and this month our Healthy Living officer had us up on our toes. 
