Fair Information you need to know....



EXHIBITOR HANDBOOK - 2024 RULE CHANGES

- Commission: Junior Livestock Auction & Vocational Arts Silent Auction Commission will be raised from 6% to 7% to match industry standards.
- Drug Testing: The Tehama District Fair Board reserves the right to drug test livestock.
- Pop-Up Tents: Pop-Up Tents with walls are not allowed in any livestock area. Pop-Up Tents
 without walls, made from nonflammable material or treated with a flame-retardant
 chemical approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshall may be placed around
 Livestock Areas. Any tent or equipment deemed by Fair Staff to be hazardous, in the way,
 or blocking fire lanes must be moved.
- Aggressive/Abusive Behavior Towards Livestock: The Tehama District Fair highly
 discourages, does not condone and will not permit aggressive behavior towards animals. If
 such behavior is witnessed the first offense will be handled with a warning, a second
 offense will result in the disqualification of the exhibitor and all entries by show
 management. All prize money and awards will also be forfeited. Protests to the
 disqualification will not be permitted.
- Back-Up Animals: Each Exhibitor is limited to One Primary Animal and <u>Three Back-Up</u> <u>Animals</u>. If an Exhibitor chooses to have more than one Back-Up Animal there will be a \$20 Tag Charge for each additional Back-Up Animal. All Back-Up Animals must be tagged, have a DNA Sample, and a picture turned in by the 120/60 Day Ownership Marks.
